Recognized as an “Outstanding Educator” with other awards in Leadership and the Environment, Jacob is the Executive Director of Camp Kawartha; an exceptional outdoor education centre. He spearheaded the construction of the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre, one of Canada’s most sustainable buildings, which is used to introduce children and future teachers to sustainable living practices, alternative energy and conservation. Jacob also helped to establish the Peterborough/Kawartha area as a UNESCO regional centre of expertise in the environment and sustainability education.

As a writer, he publishes articles on children and nature in the environment. His collaborative “The Big Book of Nature Activities” won several gold medals. His mission is teaching children about sustainable living practices, thereby creating future stewards. Come to hear more about Jacob’s fascinating passion.
